Students wishing to stay on at Holyhead Sixth Form will be able to enrol on the day. There will be support on hand from teachers and staff for students, especially for those requiring additional guidance with college or Sixth Form places. We have also organised for the Birmingham Careers Service to be present as well as representatives from Sixth Form colleges.

Y12/13 students who are expecting to collect GCSE results in English or Maths will be able to collect these from a Sixth Form specific table in the Sports Hall on GCSE Results Day. There will be no set time slot for these students and they can collect at any point between 9:00am and 12:30pm.

Y12/13 Students: What do I do if I'm waiting for GCSE English/Maths resit results?

- We will have a separate table for Sixth Form Level 2 students to collect their results on GCSE Results Day.
- The Sixth Form team will be in school on the day to carry out enrolment for Year 12 in September 2025, so if you need to speak to a member of staff regarding next steps, there will be support from our own staff as well as Careers Advisors in the Sports Hall.

What happens if I can't collect my results on the day?

If you know that you will be away for Results Day or if you are unable to attend due to ill health / unforeseen circumstances, you should inform the school by emailing exams@holyhead.crst.org.uk.

The following options for the collection of results are available to you:

- We will be able to send your results to you by email on Results Day if you inform us of your preference for this (use the exams@holyhead.crst.org.uk to do so).
- You can nominate a family member to collect your results from school in person on Results Day, however, you will need to have completed a ['Permission to Collect' form](#) and returned this to the exams@holyhead.crst.org.uk email address (this form must be completed by the student using their Holyhead School account to access the form and email).
- You can collect your results from the school reception after Results Day. There will be reception staff on site from Wednesday 27th August.
- If you have not collected your results by Monday 1st September, we will send these to your home address by post. Please ensure that your address details are accurate on Arbor.

What happens with requests for remarks?

Examination remarks may be requested **by the school** for students within 2 UMS (Uniform Mark Scale) of the next grade, following a review of the original scripts by a subject specialist, however, these appeals can only be made with the signed consent of the student.

Where this situation occurs, students will be informed on the day and have already completed a JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) consent form. Without consent, the remark cannot and will not be requested.

Students who are not able to collect their results on the day will need to sign a consent form in person at a later date.

To manage expectations, requesting a remark of scripts does not automatically lead to a change in grade, in fact ***the vast majority of remarks see no change to results*** at a significant financial cost to the school.

It is for this reason that the school has placed a **limit of 2 UMS marks away from the next grade** on the appeals we send.

What support will there be if I'm not sure about my options for Post-16?

Hopefully, by the time you get your results you will have made a clear choice about what you want to study and where, however, you may be in a situation where either the results you achieve mean you may need to change your plans, or where you have had second thoughts.

Whatever your situation we will have trained members of staff from inside and outside of Holyhead on hand to support you with your choices. The Sixth Form team at Holyhead will be helping students to enrol in the Sixth Form, whilst we will be having assistance from careers advisers from the Birmingham Careers Service. We have also invited representatives from a range of college providers to come along on GCSE Results Day, and we are awaiting confirmation of their attendance.

Please ensure on the day that wherever you intend to continue your studies, ***you inform staff collecting destinations***, as we have a requirement to send this information off to the Department for Education and Birmingham City Council.

Holyhead Sixth Form Enrolment: Extra information

**Holyhead internal applicants:
What the colour coded dots mean on your Results envelope**

Green = You have achieved the grades to enrol on the courses of your choice.

Or...

You have achieved the grades to enrol at Holyhead, but not for all of the subjects you have chosen.

You will meet with either Mr Khan, Miss Gordon or Mr Mills to complete your enrolment.

Blue = You have not achieved the minimum entry requirements to study at Holyhead Sixth Form. You will need to accept a place at another college/school (there will be Careers Guidance and support from external colleges at Holyhead in the Sports Hall)

External applicants: Things you will need to bring with you when enrolling

- Original GCSE Results certificates received from your school
- Proof of address and DoB - passport or birth certificate, provisional/driving licence.
- Students who have lived in UK less than 3 years need to bring passport and any residency or immigration document

Subject	GCSE or Equivalent Entry Requirements
Accounting	Grade 6 in Mathematics and a Grade 6 in English
Applied Science - BTEC	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a Grade 4-4 in Combined Science or Grade 4's in Separate Sciences
Art & Design	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a minimum of a Grade 5 in Art and Design
Biology	Grade 6 in Mathematics, a Grade 6-6 in Combined Science or a Grade 6 in Biology (high Grade 5 will be considered)
Business - BTEC	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics
Business Studies	Grade 5 in both English and in Mathematics
Chemistry	Grade 4 in English, a Grade 6 in Mathematics, a Grade 6-6 in Combined Science or a Grade 6 in Chemistry. (high Grade 5 will be considered). You will also need to study either Core Mathematics, A-level Mathematics to study Chemistry due to the demanding mathematical requirements of this course.
English Language & Literature	Grade 5 in English Language exam component and a Grade 5 in English Literature
French	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a minimum of a Grade 5 in French
Film Studies	Grade 4 in Mathematics, a minimum of a high Grade 4 in English and English Literature and a Grade 5 or above in GCSE Media Studies if studied
Geography	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a minimum of a Grade 5 in Geography
Health & Social Care - BTEC	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a Merit / Grade 4 in a Health and Social Care qualification if studied at Level 2 / GCSE
History	Grade 4 in Mathematics, a minimum of a Grade 5 in History or a Grade 5 in English if History was not studied at GCSE
OCR/Cambridge Technicals in IT	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a minimum of a Merit or Grade 5 in a Level 2 / GCSE Computing qualification
Law - BTEC	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics

Subject	GCSE or Equivalent Entry Requirements
Mathematics	Grade 6 in Mathematics and a Grade 5 in English
Mathematics - Core (AS level)	Grade 5 in both English and a Grade 5 in Mathematics
Music & Music Technology	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a Merit or Grade 5 in Music at Level 2 / GCSE. A Grade 4/5 should be achieved if having instrumental lessons.
Physics	Grade 4 in English, a Grade 6 in Mathematics, a Grade 6-6 in Combined Science or a Grade 6 in Physics (high Grade 5 will be considered). You will also need to study A-level Mathematics to study Physics due to the demanding mathematical requirements of this course.
Psychology	Grade 5 in English and a Grade 5 in Mathematics.
Religious Studies (Philosophy, Ethics & Islam)	Grade 4 in Mathematics, a minimum of a Grade 5 in English and/or RE or in a subject similar such as History
Sociology	Grade 4 in Mathematics, a minimum of a Grade 5 in Sociology or a Grade 5 in English if Sociology was not studied at GCSE
Spanish	Grade 4 in both English & Mathematics and a Grade 5 in Spanish
Sport - BTEC	Grade 4 in both English, Mathematics and Combined Science. It would be advantageous to have completed a BTEC Level 2 course in Sport at Merit as a minimum.
GCSE Mathematics re-sit	Grade 2/3 in Mathematics
GCSE English Language re-sit	Grade 2/3 in English Language

Holyhead Sixth Form Enrolment: Entry Requirements

- A Level subjects (including Maths and Sciences) = **Grade 6 or above**
- BTEC L3 = **Grade 4 or above including GCSE English**
- GCSE Maths **or** English resit is available
