16 to 19 Tuition Funding

In response to the disruption to learning arising from the coronavirus pandemic, we will be making use of the Government's 16-19 Tuition Fund to provide additional support for eligible students who currently study at Holyhead Sixth Form.

Students have been identified as eligible for this provision based on the criteria set out by the Education and Skills Funding Agency. We have prioritised students at Holyhead using the category criteria below:

1. Students who did not achieve a Grade 4 in either GCSE English and/or GCSE Maths by the age of 16.
2. Students who achieved a Grade 4 in GCSE English and/or GCSE Maths.

Priority within each category is being given to those students who are deemed as disadvantaged, based on previous pupil premium eligibility or current Free School Meal eligibility, and/or students with special educational needs and disabilities. Individual circumstances which have changed during the period of the pandemic are also used in consideration, as and where these arise.

Those students who are re-sitting GCSE English or maths, will be provided with additional tuition sessions from subject specialists.

Students who are eligible for extra tuition, but are not resitting GCSE English or maths, will be offered tuition, by subject specialists, in the following Level 3 Subjects:

- Accounting
- Applied Science
- Biology
- BTEC Business
- Business
- Chemistry
- Geography
- Health and Social Care
- History
- IT
- Maths
- Maths (Core)
- Music
- Performing Arts

These tuition sessions will take place after school and students will be in groups of no more than 3 students. During the period of school closure these sessions will take place virtually using Zoom, and there will be

flexibility for on-site tuition sessions once circumstances allow for this.
